## NOTES:

- 1. The penalty for breaking any commandment concerning the sabbath was death, or being "cut off" (Ex.31:14-15; Neh.15:32-36).
- 2. One solar year contains 52 weeks. Therefore, there were 52 weekly sabbath days each year. When the other sabbaths days listed on page one are added, this means that THERE WERE 60 SABBATH DAYS EACH YEAR (during years in which none of the other sabbath days fell on a weekly sabbath day).
- 3. The Old Covenant sabbaths were figures of the true Rest, which God has yet to give to those who trust Him (Heb. 4:1-11; Col. 2:16-17; notice Isa. 1:13).
- 4. This true Rest is now foreshadowed not by sabbath days but by the power and holiness of the Spirit of God within a person's heart (Isa. 28:11-12; Mt. 11:28;1Cor. 14:21-22).
