- 18. His beloved Rachel died giving birth to Benjamin.
- 19. There was constant family discord because of his special affection for Joseph.
- 20. Joseph was apparently killed by a wild animal.
- 21. When a terrible famine struck, he had to send his sons to Egypt for food.
- 22. His sons returned, except for Simeon, who was held hostage by the ruler of Egypt.
- 23. The ruler of Egypt demanded that Rachel's other son Benjamin be brought to Egypt.
