THE SHOUT

According to biblical scholars, the Hebrew word (teru'-ah, or one of its forms) for "shout" in the verses below means "a shout (of joy) with religious impulse".

SCRIPTURE	THE SHOUT
Ps. 27:6	The phrase here means "sacrifices of joyful shouts"
Psalms: 47:1 66:1; 81:1 98:4, 6; 100:1	This shouting is the "joyful noise" of God's people.
Job 8:20-21	God makes the joyful noise happen! It is not an earthly "religious impulse". (There is a difference between making "a joyful noise" and making a racket.)
Ps. 89:15	Those who are familiar with this holy sound are blessed and will be saved.
Things God does that cause His people to shout for joy	
2Sam. 6:12-16	Who: King David and all of Israel Reason: bringing the ark of God into Jerusalem
2Chron. 15:8-15	Who: King Asa and the people of Israel Reason: a renewal of the covenant with God
Ezra 3:11-13	Who: the beleaguered, returned exiles Reason: the rebuilding of the ruined temple of God in Jerusalem
Ps. 47:5	Who: the Lord Jesus Reason: returning home to be with his Father
1Thess. 4:15-16	Who: the Lord Jesus Reason: coming again for his people
Job. 38:7	Who: angels Reason: joy
Job 33:14-26	Who: men Reason: seeing God face to face

Ex. 32:17 1Sam. 4:5-6	Who: disobedient children of God Reason: trusting in things
