


<u>Across</u>

- 1. Abraham built an altar and planted a grove here.
- 6. Largest mountain in this region. Northeast of the Sea of Chinneroth.
- 7. One of David's hiding places while fleeing from Saul.
- 8. Abraham camped here. Nearby, at Mamre, are buried Abraham & Sarah, Isaac & Rebekah, and Jacob & Leah. David reigned over Judah here for 7 1/2 years.
- 11. The desert area in southern Canaan and extending farther south.
- 13. Country immediately north of Israel.
- 17. God chose it to be capital of the United Kingdom of Israel.
- 18. Descendants of Lot, Abraham's nephew, located south of the Arnon River.
- 21. The capital of Ammon.
- 22. The men of this city of Benjamin sinned so greatly that the other tribes almost eradicated Benjamin from Israel. King Saul's headquarters.
- 23. A mount near Shechem from which Israel heard God's curses.
- 25. The river that is the border between the tribe of Reuben and Moab.
- 28. A sea that is the principle source of the Jordan.
- 30. A city of refuge located east of Jordan.
- 33. A mount near Shechem from which Israel heard God's blessings.
- 34. Where Lot lived before it was destroyed for immorality.
- 36. The large river which flows out of Gilead into the Jordan.
- 37. Along with the Salt Sea, the river that is the eastern border of Canaan's land.
- 38. Where Joshua and Israel first camped in Canaan's land. Joshua built an altar here and circumcised Israel's men. Where Saul was confirmed as Israel's king.
- 40. One of Israel's constant OT enemies to the northeast.
- 44. The tribe who has territory east and west of the Jordan River.
- 45. Invaders in Canaan's land who possessed permanently a huge part of Judah's territory along the Great Sea.
- 46. The northernmost city of refuge.
- 47. The tribe from Jacob's youngest son.

- 2. Abraham worshiped here. Jacob dreamed of a ladder reaching into heaven here.
- 3. The Philistines hanged the bodies of Saul and his sons on the walls of this city.
- 4. The first city in Canaan conquered by Joshua and Israel.
- 5. The river which flows past Mt. Carmel into the Great Sea.
- 9. A mountain by the River Kishon and the Great Sea.
- 10. Saul began his reign by rescuing this city from Ammon. The men of this city came by night and rescued the bodies of Saul and his sons from the walls of Beth-shean.
- 12. Descendants of Esau, Israel's twin brother.
- 14. The hill country east of the Sea of Chinneroth. It is known for its fat cattle.
- 15. Where the descendants of cursed Canaan lived. The land which was promised by God to Abraham.
- 16. The tribe in which King David was born.
- 19. The tribe that Joshua was born in.
- 20. The city of refuge located farthest to the southeast.
- 24. Where Israel was camped when Moses died. Where Moses numbered Israel the 2nd time, after the forty years of Wilderness Wanderings.
- 26. The mountain where Moses viewed Canaan's land and then died.
- 27. The city of refuge located farthest to the northeast.
- 29. The mountain where Saul and Jonathan died.
- 31. The inhabitants of this city, and some others around it, successfully deceived Joshua and escaped being put to death.
- 32. Descendants of Lot, Abraham's nephew, whose territory was north of the Arnon River.
- 34. Where Dinah was molested. A city of refuge.
- 35. The western border of Canaan.
- 38. The hill country east of the Jordan River.
- 39. The brook which divides Ephraim and Manasseh.
- 40. The first capital of Israel, being the first "permanent" location for the tabernacle in Canaan. It was forsaken by God.
- 41. Part of the eastern border of Canaan. The Jordan River empties into it.
- 42. A tribe in Israel named after Jacob's second son.
- 43. Jacob wrestled with an angel here. Jacob's name changed to Israel here.
