

“Children of Belial”

“Belial” is made of two words: meaning “without”, and means “to be valuable”.

Thus, “Belial” means “without value”, or “a worthless person”.

“Belial” is never used in the Bible except in reference to ungodly children of God.

Here are all the places in the Bible where the word “Belial “ is mentioned:

Scripture	Qualities	Punishment
Dt. 13:13	unfaithful children of God, idolaters	death, then burn all they have touched (Dt. 13:15-16)
Jud. 19:22	bisexual or homosexual children of God	death (Jud. 20:13)
1Sam. 1:16	children of God who are given to drunkenness (or today, a “druggie”)	-
1Sam. 2:12-16, 22	irreverent children of God, or children of God who bully other children of God.	death (1Sam. 2:34)
1Sam. 10:25-27	unbelieving and stubborn children of God	-
1Sam. 25:17, 25	unjust, self-indulging, greedy, ill-tempered children of God	death (1Sam. 25:37-38)
1Sam. 3:22	harsh and unmerciful children of God	-
2Sam. 20:1	rebellious children of God	death (2Sam. 20:22)
