13° <sup>2</sup> Saul picked three thousand men, keeping two thousand of them with him in Michmash and in the hill country of Bethel and sending one thousand with his son Jonathan to Gibeah, in the territory of the tribe of Benjamin. The rest of the men Saul sent home.

³ Jonathan killed the Philistine commander in Geba, and all the Philistines heard about it. Then Saul sent messengers to call the Hebrews to war by blowing a trumpet throughout the whole country. ⁴ All the Israelites were told that Saul had killed the Philistine commander and that the Philistines hated them. So the people answered the call to join

Saul at Gilgal. <sup>5</sup> The Philistines assembled to fight the Israelites; they had thirty thousand war chariots, six thousand horsemen, and as many soldiers as there are grains of sand on the seashore. They went to Michmash, east of Bethaven, and camped there. <sup>6</sup> Then they launched a strong attack against the Israelites, putting them in a desperate situation. Some of the Israelites hid in caves and holes or among the rocks or in pits and wells; 7 others crossed the Jordan River into the territories of Gad and Gilead.

Saul was still at Gilgal, and the people with him were trembling with fear. 8 He waited seven days for Samuel, as Samuel had instructed him to do, but Samuel still had not come to Gilgal. Assistance Promised. ## III: SAUL AND DAVID CHAPTER 13

<sup>1</sup>[Saul was . . . years old when he became king and he reigned . . . (two) years

over Israel.]\* Saul Offers Sacrifice. <sup>2</sup> Saul chose three thousand men of Israel, of whom two thousand remained with him in Michmash and in the hill country of Bethel, and one thousand were with Jonathan in Gibeah of Benjamin. He sent the rest of the people back to their tents. 3 Now Jonathan overcame the Philistine garrison\* which was in Gibeah, and the Philistines got word of it. Then Saul sounded the horn throughout the land, with a proclamation, "Let the Hebrews hear!" p 4 Thus all Israel learned that Saul had overcome the garrison of the Philistines and that Israel had brought disgrace upon the Philistines; and the soldiers were called up to Saul in Gilgal. <sup>5</sup>The Philistines also assembled for battle, with three thousand chariots, six thousand horsemen, and foot soldiers as numerous as the sands of the seashore. Moving up

LORD sent thunder and rain that day; and all the people greatly feared the LORD and Samuel.

10 And it came about as soon as he finished offering the burnt offering, that behold, Samuel came; and Saul went out to meet him and to greet him.

11 But Samuel said, "What have your done?" And Saul said, "Because I saw that the people were scattering from me, and that you did not come within the appointed days, and that the Philistines were assembling at Michmash.

12 therefore I said, 'Now the Philistines will come down against me at Gilgal, and I have not asked the favor of the LORD.' So I forced myself and offered the burnt offering."

13 And Samuel said to Saul, "You have acted foolishly; you have not kept the commandment of the Lord your God, which He commanded you, for now the Lord would have established your kingdom over Israel forever.

14 "But now your kingdom shall not endure. The Lord has sought out for Himself a man after His own heart, and the Lord has appointed him as ruler over His people, because you have not kept what the Lord commanded you."





Some suppose that he reigned twelve years; others put the figure at twenty-two (see note d). 5: Beth-aven, probably an alternatwe name for Bethel. 7: Crossed the Jordan, see Judg 12.5. Gad and Gilead, east of the Jordan. 13.7b-15a: Saul's ritual sin and rejecon by God. This passage is more hostile to Saul than ch 15, another explanation of Saul's

rejection. The thought is that the king had no right to exercise priestly functions, or at least Saul had no such right. Contrast the very different view of 14.31-35, where Saul definitely assists in priestly functions. Later David (2 Sam 6.12-19; 24.25) and Solomon (1 Kings 3.15) also exercised such functions.
